Why play chess?

Chess is fun! It is a lifetime hobby, and so much more. Once mastered can be played with family and friends of all ages and nationalities. Through chess, we learn how to analyse a situation by focusing on important factors and by eliminating distractions.

Chess is a game that involves strategy, risk management, creative thinking, and the ability to manage your emotions.

- Chess is about ***making decisions, analysing the problems, abstract reasoning.***
- Chess is a fantastic tool for ***developing character*** at a young age such as *resilience, patience, sportsmanship*. Understand that decisions have consequences, “**growth mind-set**” – learns from setbacks.
- Chess also brings together all ages, nationalities, backgrounds, and gender.

In the club children will have fun learning with children of similar age. During the club the children are taught various tactics, opening and endgames. They will solve chess puzzles in a tutored, interactive class setting.

There will be a tournament during the term with prizes for all including a winner's trophy and medals for runners-up.

In order to improve your child's chess skills, I would recommend they try to play three games of chess a week.

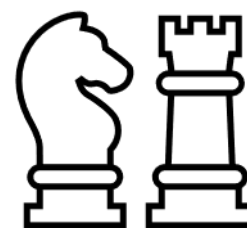
Autumn Term 2024 Year 5&6 Monday Lunch Time Chess Club
